



# Instructions for Families


Please have your child read the passage aloud for one minute. Do not stop your child during this time. Note any errors made, but do not correct them. If your child is stuck on a word, you may provide the word after 3 seconds has gone by.

When one minute is complete, calculate how many words your child read correctly. The numbers on the side of the passage will help. Errors include words that are skipped or said incorrectly. Record how many words your child read correctly in one minute.

Accuracy can be calculated by dividing the number of words read correctly by the total number of words read in all. For example, if your child read 97 words correct and had 3 errors, the total would be 100 words. 97 words correct divided by 100 total words would equal 97%. Record your child's accuracy percentage.

This should be done 3 times for one minute each time. When your child is finished have your child answer the comprehension questions on the back of this page.

Remember, when your child practices their fluency they are strengthening their word recognition, expression, accuracy and speed; all important skills for being a great reader!






