Literacy

Decades of literacy research has determined seven main skill areas that need to be taught for a student to become literate. These are oral language, phonological and phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary, reading fluency, reading comprehension, and writing (Castles, Rastle, & Nation, 2018). Each of these key areas are supported through our membership resources.

Research on literacy has also emphasized the importance of teaching skills in an explicit, systematic, and structured manner (National Reading Panel, 2000). The membership literacy resources are skill-focused, allowing teachers to follow these important guidelines for instruction.

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Mathematics

The National Council of Teachers of Mathematics (NCTM) has outlined five important math content standard domains: number and operations, algebra, geometry, measurement, and data analysis. The NCTM also promotes research-based five process standards: problem solving, reasoning, communication, connections, and representation. Each of these key domains and standards are supported through our membership resources.

Research has also emphasized the importance of teaching math skills in a manner that scaffolds students through the phases of math mastery (Leong, Ho, & Cheng, 2015). The three phases of math mastery are concrete, pictorial, and abstract (CPA). The CPA approach to teaching math has been demonstrated to have a positive impact on students' mathematical reasoning (Putri, Suwangsih, Rahayu, Nikawanti, Enzelina, & Wahyudy 2020).

SEL instruction supports students in acquiring and applying knowledge, skills, and dispositions for success in life. SEL also can help to advance equity and trust in a learning environment.

The organization behind SEL is the Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning (CASEL). There are five key principles for SEL instruction that CASEL has identified: self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision-making. Each of these key components of SEL instruction is supported through our membership resources for social and emotional learning and character education.
