ALL ABOUT LOTERÍA

GAME SET-UP

- 1) Print and cut out the cards on page 3-5 and shuffle them. Place them in a pile face down.
- 2) The game boards are two to a page. Print the game boards and cut the pages in half.
- 3) Give each player a board and a handful of beans.

HOW TO PLAY

This classroom version of Loteria is great for our little learners.

- 1) The caller pulls a card from the deck.
- 2) If the card matches one on their board ("*tabla*" or "*carta*") then students cover it with a bean.
- 3) The caller continues to pull and announce cards. It's up to students to keep track of what's been called. That's part of the fun!

Winning – When all spaces on a student's board are covered then they yell, "LOTERIA!" to announce they've won. If all 6 spaces is a little too much for your students, try starting with just 3 in a row. Decide beforehand what you think your students can handle.

THE HISTORY

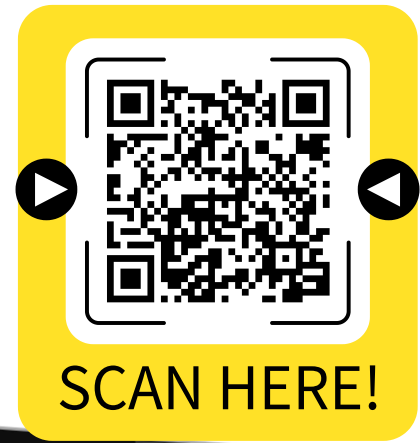
Loteria is a bingo-like game that is closely tied to Mexican culture. The game originated in Italy but came to Mexico with the Spanish. It was originally played by the wealthy but eventually spread.

Loteria is perfect for all ages because it's easy to pick up and difficulty can be added based on ages. Variations include playing multiple boards at once or using riddles to describe the cards instead of their names. The caller often cracks jokes to distract the players.
